Dear Mr. Nucker:

This refers to a conversation this date between Mr. Loring Hiller of this Division and yourself regarding steam locomotives on the Alaska Railroad which might become available for disposal in the future in view of the dieselization program on that railroad.

Our Mission in Greece anticipates the need for a presently unknown number of locomotives for the Greek Railways and although 2-10-2 or 2-10-0 type with 20 ton as le weight limit are preferred, it is believed the 2-8-0, which we understand is the type now in use on the Alaska Railways, can be utilized.

I would appreciate it if you would ascertain and advise me whether, when and how many of these Alaska steam locomotives will become available, and the price they would likely bring, if that can reasonably be forecasted. I understand the availability is largely dependent upon improvement of portions of the Alaska line to enable use of the heavier diesels.
